Reggae Roots - the UKs first young people's reggae choir

A year ago, we sat round a table at Music House with Sheila Howarth - teacher, community ambassador and key instigator for the Leeds West Indian Carnival. Sheila is one of our community's influential, black female ambassadors - her passion to help young people thrive in a creative, safe and self-empowering way is her life's work.



Sheila had a vision to create the first young people's reggae choir. The more she shared, the more we wanted to help. Rehearsal space was easy - our building would be offered freely. We just needed some money! Sheila is a trustee for the Geraldine Connor Foundation (GCF) so we quickly set up a meeting with CEO, Selina McGonagle. It made perfect sense for our two charities to partner because of the synergy in

our aims and ambitions. Selina drew up an action plan, identified a potential funding stream via The World Reimagined - which coincidentally was offering grants for projects of this kind. Selina secured £3,000. We were on our way!

We approached singer songwriter Annette Judah Morris whose reggae music career spans over 40 years as part of the duet, Royal Blood. Christella Litras was also asked to work alongside Annette to share musical directorship.

Reggae Roots is for 8-19 year olds, from diverse backgrounds. The choir aims to provide young people with space outside of school to be creative, perform and improve their mental health and wellbeing through music.

Reggae Roots ... by royal appointment

Reggae Roots, the UK's first youth reggae choir, were selected to perform for King Charles III at his coronation concert.



Reggae Roots formed part of the 300-strong Coronation Choir which kicked off the musical extravaganza on the eve of 7 May. A once-in-a-lifetime experience, we are hugely proud of our young people. As well as representing our great city, this was an unforgettable experience. If you missed the concert watch it here. Reggae Roots also featured in the BBC documentary Sing For The King: The Search for the Coronation Choir - a behind the scenes look at how the 300 strong choir was mentored for their starring performance.

Tim Knight's masterpiece nominated for Classic FM award

Tim was nominated again in the Classic FM Hall of Fame for another of his masterpieces. His eight minute orchestral piece *'Elegy for an English summer'* recorded by Czech Philharmonic, illustrates the end of the English summer. It features the oboe (a very English instrument) and the piece tells the story of how a summer's day fades away as the season changes to another.





It's pretty amazing to be nominated and we were delighted for Tim - he really is a world-class composer.

Although he didn't win the award in March, we are glad! Why say that? Simply because if you're a living, breathing composer it's almost impossible to win. In years to come, we are certain Tim's legacy will live on, but for now, he has much work to do composing, conducting, creating and enriching lives.

The end of an era as Tim Knight steps down as Principal

At the end of this month, Tim Knight will be stepping down from his role as Principal of Music House. In his own words - which sums it up perfectly...

"Life moves on and after 22 years at the Yorkshire College of Music and Drama (now Music House) other exciting projects have come on the horizon for me. To take advantage of these and knowing that Music House is on an exciting future path, I am stepping down as Principal. It has been a fantastic time creating opportunities for pupils, teaching - I would guess - probably around 500 pupils over the years. Some of whom are now composers and singers in the classical music industry, sourcing the new building, returning after Covid and the general ups and downs of a musical establishment. But now, onwards and upwards for both Music House and myself."

With her endless list of music contacts, Stella has secured professionals to sound-proof the room to ensure the best acoustics. The space will include a digital audio workstation, PA system complete with microphones, stands and headphones, mixing area, cables and equipment store.



Our studio will be perfect for audio recording, voiceovers, podcasts and webinars.

Affordable recording space is not easy to find in Leeds. Our research and talking to local music industry professionals has informed us well. Helping our communities (young and old) to have access to a recording studio for an hour or two, to get creative ticks all our charitable aims.

Masterclasses, workshops and holiday camps

Centre of Excellence for Music Theory

We believe Music House is *centre of excellence* for *music theory.* Why do we think this?

First of all, we have lost count of the hundred of students we have taught music theory to over the years with 100% success rate, which has meant they've secured a place at their chosen university. Secondly, we are the only music establishment in Leeds (that we know of) which offers music theory. We have developed our music theory lessons to a very high level and our tutors are highly skilled and qualified.



Over the years, our ever popular Grade 1-5 ABRSM music theory class has attracted a wide range of music students from our region who have either been sent to us by recommendation or by their private music tutors.

We champion small group learning - a maximum of six students per lesson. The benefits include:

 dedicated time to ask questions and discuss / debate and students can enrol at any time, they don't need to wait until a new term. Due to popular demand, we've added another lesson to our timetable. Classes run every Wednesday and Thursday at 7-8pm. Newbies can join at any time.

Jam around the Table workshops

Jam Around The Table is a <u>GCF</u> funded project for 14-19 year olds. In a nutshell, this project runs a series of workshops which are fun opportunities for participants to express themselves while taking care of their mental health and wellbeing.

In under two years (correct at time of publishing), the project has run **three** sessions

across **nine** days, attracting a very diverse group who have forged lasting friendships though their love of music, poetry, self-expression and personal development. Teens are encouraged to create their own songs, poems and forms of expression which they get to perform at a workshop finale celebration for friends and family.

'Don't ignore your own potential' Not only does Jam Around the Table empower young people, this project is where we recruited many of the original members of Reggae Roots.


