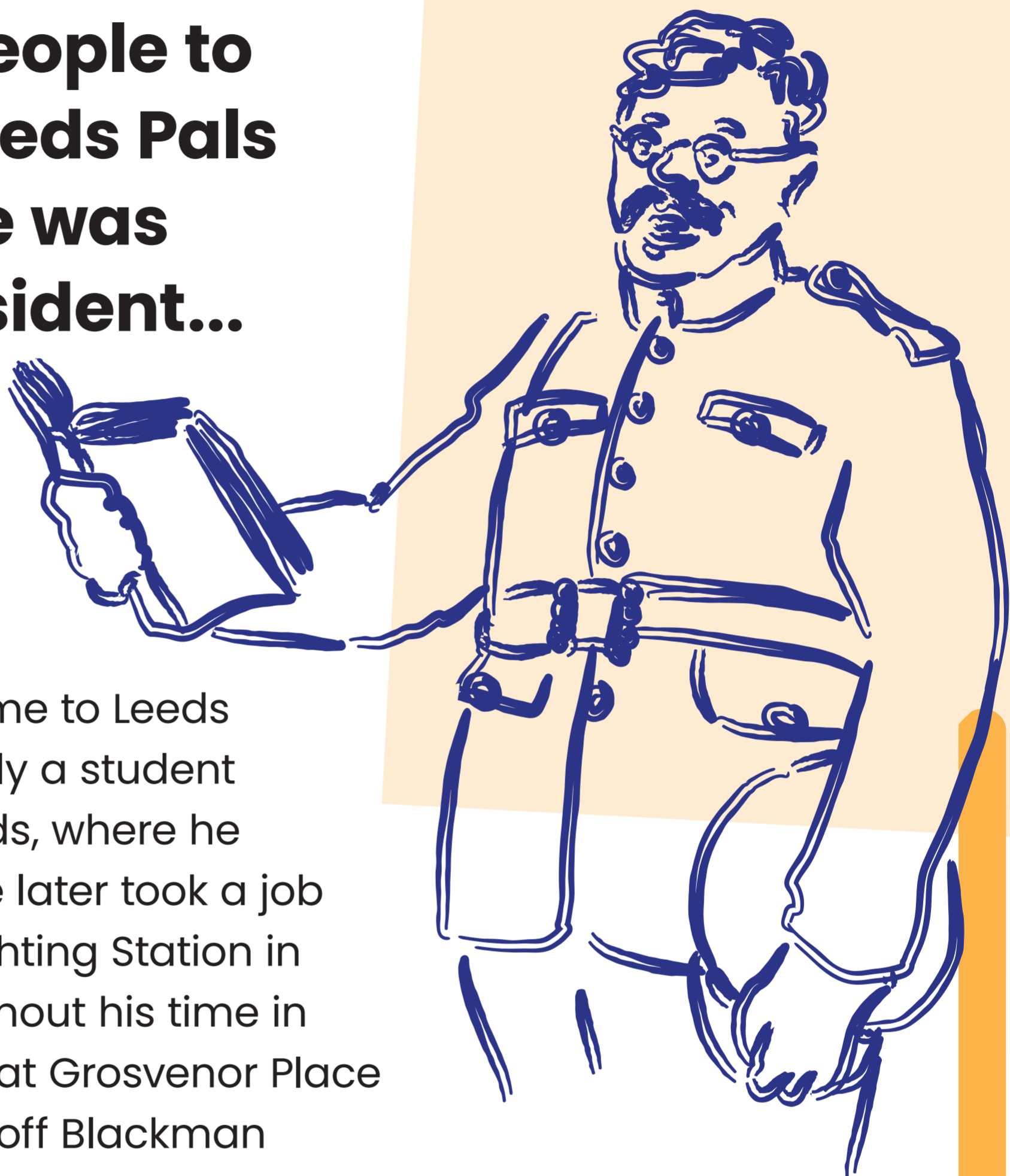

One of the first people to sign up for the Leeds Pals in World War One was a Woodhouse resident... from Bengal.



Jogendra Nath Sen came to Leeds from India in 1910. Initially a student at the University of Leeds, where he studied engineering, he later took a job at the Leeds Electric Lighting Station in Whitehall Road. Throughout his time in Leeds, he was resident at Grosvenor Place (now demolished), just off Blackman Lane in Woodhouse.

He was one of several Indians who came to Leeds to study around this time and was a regular visitor to Mill Hill Chapel, the Unitarian Church in City Square, where he became a member of the Chapel choir.
